

Sort waste into colourful bags!

With colour sorting you sort residual waste, organic waste, packaging, and newspapers into differently coloured bags. When the bags are full you throw them into your bin. If you want a larger bin or more frequent collection you are welcome to order it.

Recycling stations remain available

All recycling stations are still available so you can continue to dispose of your waste there as before, without coloured bags. You are also welcome to the recycling centre Bredemad.

How do I get more bags?

When you need more, tie a bag of the colour(s) you need to your bin, and we will provide new ones during rubbish collection. This applies to all coloured bags except for the two turquoise ones for glass, which look slightly different. In the spring you will receive bags that should last the entire season. If they are not enough you are welcome to leave the glass packaging at a recycling station.

Why should I sort my waste?

According to Swedish legislation you are obligated to sort your waste. We are moving the collection closer to you to make it easier for you. When more packaging can be recycled, we save together on natural resources and reduce unnecessary emissions.

How to colour-sort:

Sorting guide for the home

1. Sort your waste into the different bags.
2. When a bag is full, tie it together with a double knot.
3. Throw all bags into your bin.

In the coloured bags, you dispose of residual waste, organic waste, packaging, and newspapers. However, there are also other types of waste such as broken drinking glasses, old plastic toys, and metal scrap. This type of waste should be deposited at the Bredemad recycling centre.

NOTE! The following must not be thrown into any of the bags:

- Leftover medications are returned to the pharmacy.
- Hazardous waste, batteries, and small electrical waste are placed in your red environmental box or deposited at Bredemad.
- Electrical waste and bulk waste are deposited at Bredemad. You can also have bulk waste collected five times a year.

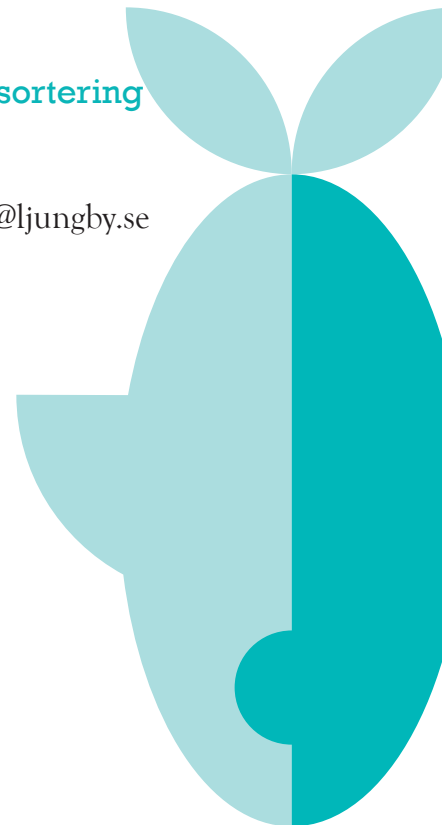

Organic waste

Green bag



What's left over when you eat or cook, such as: food scraps, bones, shells, and coffee filters.



Residual waste

Red bag



Trash that cannot be recycled such as: household paper, napkins, envelopes, chewing gum, snuff, diapers, and cigarette butts.



Plastic packaging

Purple bag



Packaging in hard and soft plastic such as: cans, tubes, bottles, bags, and corks.



Paper packaging

Beige bag



Packaging in paper such as: cardboard, bags, and corrugated cardboard.



Metal packaging

Grey bag



Packaging in metal such as: canned food, spray cans, tubes, caps, and lids.



Return paper

Blue bag



Newspapers, catalogues, pocketbooks, and advertising leaflets.



Clear glass

Light turquoise bag



Bottles and jars made of clear glass.



Coloured glass

Turquoise bag



Bottles and jars made of coloured glass.
